Eligibility

- ◆ All applicants must have attended **The Scholarship Workshop** or a scholarship teleseminar conducted by Marianne Ragins within the past year. For the current scholarship eligibility period, you must have attended between the dates of April 30, 2025 and April 30, 2026.
- ◆ The scholarship is available to high school seniors as well as undergraduate and graduate students.
- ◆ Applicants must either be attending or planning to attend an accredited undergraduate or graduate educational institution. Documentation may be required.

About the Scholarship

- ◆ Scholarship amounts vary.
- ◆ All scholarships awarded are nonrenewable.
- ◆ The scholarship will be awarded and must be used in the academic year following receipt of the scholarship.

 - Essay
 - Application
 - Extracurricular activities

 - Leadership potential
- ◆ Qualities that should be displayed by applicant's essay and application are the following:
 - Self-motivation
 - Determination
 - Persistence

- ◆ All applications must be received by April 30, 2026.
